PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

Our year of sight, 2020, was different than anticipated. However, the Michigan Foundation for Vision Awareness (MFVA) Board continued the mission with conference calls and Zoom meetings. Thanks to all of our contributors' support, we were still able to fund every grant that came through this year that met our mission. This included optometric scholarships, vision research projects, providing medical contact lenses to the underserved and uninsured in Southeast Michigan, Opening Eyes at Special Olympics, student mission trips with Volunteers of Optometric Services to Humanity (VOSH), and color testing equipment for the University Eye Clinic at the Michigan College of Optometry.

This year was difficult for many people and many businesses. Our board wanted to give back to our communities in a meaningful way. With a combination of generous donations from MFVA, Kasperek USA Optical, Johnson & Johnson, and Bausch and Lomb we were able to provide supplies to six non-profit clinics throughout Michigan. The donations included glasses defogging spray, contact lens solution, various eye drops, and personal protective equipment to patients at these non-profit clinics. Our mission of supporting vision and eye health care remains strong and we are proud to see how our optometric community is continuing to serve patients.

A new and exciting area of development for an underserved population was seen in the announcement this fall that Meijer made the Aira application available at no cost to in-store customers. The Board sent them a letter commending them for this decision to make shopping more accessible to blind and visually impaired customers throughout the state of Michigan. We're excited for this opportunity for our low vision patients as well as for the education and awareness it provides to the public.

Another new educational tool that 2020 has brought to optometry and the MFVA is online continuing education. With this, the MFVA has been able to broadcast a video at both the MOA Great Lakes Eyecare Conference and the MOA Fall Seminar. This video educated attendees about who the MFVA is, what we do, and how to get involved. Did you see our video? We hope so! Though our fellow colleagues have adapted this year by committing to virtual events, we are still hopeful that this coming year will bring safer opportunities for in-person events. As you may already know, our plans for hosting our 2020 Annual Meeting in Big Rapids had to be placed on hold. While we still managed to enjoy our online Zoom meeting, the Board is hoping to meet in person and possibly with some outside events in Big Rapids this summer. The decision will be made late spring as we see how of the health of our state is, so stay tuned for details.

2020 MFVA ACTIVITIES

In 2020, the MFVA donated \$37,495 in grants and \$20,000 in scholarships.

The MFVA has donated \$585,000 in scholarships since 1958!

- \$15,000 to SVOSH for 2020/2021 trips
- \$12,500 to the Association for the Blind & Visually Impaired (ABVI) to stock two mobile eye clinics
- \$5,000 to Michigan Eye and Contact Lens to provide medically necessary specialty contact lenses for low income patients
- \$4,995 to MCO Occupational Vision (Drs. Swan and Buckingham) for a Cone Contrast Test

- Various trial magnifiers and prismatic glasses
- Lighting equipment
- Various testing & diagnostic items
- Retinoscopes...and much more!

MFVA Community Outreach Project

The MFVA is aware of how significantly the COVID-19 affected individuals pandemic has many communities. In fulfilling our own mission, at the Annual Meeting the MFVA Board initiated a community assistance project to help meet the practical vision care needs of community members! The Board unanimously voted to allocate \$2,000 in funding, and with the additional generous support of Kasperek USA Optical, Johnson & Johnson, and individual members from the MFVA Board, we have provided kits of supplies for several clinics to distribute to patients in need. These kits included contact lens cases and solutions. Defog It spray, various eye drops, face shields and other PPE supplies. These products were distributed to the following clinics:
